Principal's message



Our college NSS team was awarded a Leadership Certificate from Sambandh Health Foundation and Narayana Health Foundation for our efforts in promoting the 'Spit Free India Movement'.

SCOUTS & GUIDES:

Our Scouts & Guides wing, under the leadership of Sai Arjun (III B.Com), has been attending various camps, students of Degree and PU are actively involved.

VALUE-ADDED COURSES:

Mile Stone Academy conducted coaching for Banking Exams, 40 students enrolled for the same. Students had to take up online tests and Certificates were issued on completion of the course.

Skillzenith Consulting conducted a 33-hour course on Communicative English. 14 students received certificates on clearing the final assessments.

Tally ERP-9 and Advanced Excel Courses were conducted in association with Mark Education Academy. 23 and 48 students enrolled for the courses, respectively, and were awarded certificate after successful completion of the courses.

OLYMPIAD:

International Commerce Olympiad in Accountancy, Business Studies & Economics, was organised on 19th December 2019, for First Year Pre-University. 33 students cleared the exam, and were awarded Certificate of Merit.

TRIVIA 2019:

'TRIVIA 2019' quiz competition was organised on 18th December 2019 for students of PU and ITI Colleges. Around 80 students from eight colleges participated. The winners were awarded with cash prize of Rs.5000, Rs.3000 and Rs.2000.

CAREER GUIDANCE PROGRAMMES:

In order to help students understand the opportunities that lie ahead of them, the Placement Cell organised one-day career guidance programme "Campus Connect" for students of final year on 11th July 2019.

The team also conducted such counselling programmes in other colleges, such as Yelahanka Government College, Bagalur Government College, Government ITI College, etc. Students were informed of higher education and career prospects.

PLACEMENT DRIVE:

Placement Drives were organised for students of final year, in February and March 2020, by MyGate & Quess Corp Ltd. for Wipro & Accenture; and Hudl India & Glory Sports, exclusively for those who want to pursue a career in Sports.

Students from other colleges like Bishop Cotton Women's Christian College, Triveni College, Soundarya College, SB College, Sindhi College, Christ College, Kristu Jayanti College etc. also attended.

A total of 296 students were shortlisted through these campus drives.

EXAMINATIONS:

Our college being one of the exam-centres, four more colleges were tagged with us. Our Degree students performed exceptionally well in the BU and BCU examinations, some even secured Centums.

As per UGC directives, 2nd and 4th semester exams were waived off, with students being promoted considering the Internal Assessment marks and that secured in the previous semester.

Our first batch of PU had their II PU final exams in February / June 2020, and their results were good too.

A one-day recreational trip was organised for the students of 1st and 2nd PU, on 30th September 2019, to Valley Vibes Resort, Ramanagara. There were 37 students from both the classes, accompanied by three faculty coordinators.

Once two young amateur photographers named Peter and McKinnon started going through their archive of old projects they worked on, Peter did this because he wanted to relive the moment and to pride himself that he is the best at his work. But McKinnon did this because he believed that we all started somewhere.

When we look at the work of great artists in history, it is easy to say 'I can never accomplish that level of work' but we often forget they also once stood in our shoes when they first started.

Both Peter and McKinnon had 2 different ways of motivation, their goal was the same, to be great filmmakers.

Their journey to becoming an artist began in 2010, when both started their freshman year at a charter film school. For four years, they attended G-Star School of Arts, where their passions for photography and filmmaking were ignited. A few days later, both made their first short film. After completing the project, the teacher had come over to them and said:

"Hey, you kids got a good eye. You should consider doing this as your profession. I think you've got a future in it."

After hearing that, it clicked. Peter was flying high with pride, whereas McKinnon had fallen in love with the process of creating something with the camera.

From that point on, both decided that they wanted to do interesting work with their camera for the rest of their lives. Then, in the second week of school, both emptied their bank accounts and bought themselves their first camera.

Peter bought a Canon I DX MARK II, which is one of the high end cameras in the industry; whereas, McKinnon purchased Canon 1500D which is cheaper and had a lower picture quality.

In the final year of film school, both Peter and McKinnon were offered 2 different short films in which they had to work individually. Peter believed that he could do it all alone because he believed he was the best. But, McKinnon was happy that he got to live his dreams and explore himself in the field of photography.

Peter showed less interest in his short film because he thought the project was a waste of his time and skills. He completed his project in a week and never bothered about the review as he was blindfolded by his pride and ego.

As for McKinnon, he was happy and nervous that he had got a chance to prove himself. When he started shooting, he would constantly ask himself:

"If nobody saw my work, would I still keep working on it?"

And the answer was always a resounding "Yes".

Four weeks of shooting daily, failing countless times, and sleepless nights embracing his passion before anybody really saw his work, he had finally completed his project.

Both the short-films, along with others, were submitted to the Film Council to be reviewed. At Amy Film Festival, Peter's movie was disregarded as it was lifeless and had no moral value to it.

As for McKinnon, he garnered 3 Gold medals at the National level and was invited to an exhibition and ceremony at Carnegie Hall to join the council of filmmakers. McKinnon was in awe when he heard it. Still shocked, a few moments later, the director of the organisation pulled out the May 29 issue of The New York Times, McKinnon was in utter disbelief... his movie poster had made the front page in The New York Times!!!

What we take from this is that pride can give us confidence but there is a high chance of falling in the pits of ego, as Pride and Success are two parallel lines, they never meet.

Instead if we are passionate about our work and are willing to learn from our mistakes, it will definitely put us on the path to success. Hard work, passion, perseverance may not yield quick results, but you will definitely see success at some point during your journey.



PHYSICAL FITNESS ITS IMPACT ON YOUNGER GENERATION

Physical fitness is a state of health and well-being and more specifically, the ability to perform aspects of sports, occupations and daily activities. Physical fitness is generally achieved through proper nutrition, moderate – vigorous physical exercise and sufficient rest.

Physical activities are vital for the younger generation's development and lay the foundation for a healthy and active lifestyle. Physical activities not only provide health benefits, it provides learning experiences that link to the younger generation's interests, abilities and identity. Youths who are physically fit can sleep better, and are able to handle physical and emotional challenges better, which helps in areas such as studying for an exam, coping with stress and being more resilient. Youths who are active will have:

- •stronger muscles and bones
- •lower tendency to become over weight
- •lower risk of developing Type 2 Diabetes
- •lower blood pressure and blood cholesterol levels
- •improved posture and balance
- •better physical and mental strength
- •improved concentration and thinking strength
- •overall better outlook of life

A dance class or soccer practice, riding bikes or playing tag does count as physical exercise but just how much exercise should the younger generation get? Young lads should exercise for two hours or more every day. This does not have to be all in one go; it can be spread out the entire day. You can stretch in the morning (flexibility), ride your bike to school (Aerobic) and walk with your family after dinner. So get up and move! Don't sit still for more than an hour at a time. After an hour get up and move for 10 minutes, your body will thank you.

Morning Exercise:

One of the most common reasons people don't do as much Exercise as they should is because they say don't have time, and let's face it, after 8+hours at work, who wants to workout instead of spending time with the family. But, if you do make that effort, here are the benefits:

- A morning workout enhances your metabolism. You will burn more calories as the
 day goes on as you will have an increased breathing rate and higher heart rate and
 the body will burn energy to actively bring them back to resting rate throughout
 the day.
- It will improve training consistency and create good habits, if you get up early and exercise before your day has started you are less likely to have interruptions that are going to disturb your training schedule.
- A morning exercise routine will kick start your day and give you a good sense of fatigue, so by the time you are ready for bed at night your sleep quality will be improved.
- Morning exercise can be more effective than having a cup of coffee when you wake up. When you wake up and get moving, studies have shown that your physical and mental energy will be improved.

MAKE RESOLUTIONS FOR THE YEAR:

1. Set SMART Goals

- a. Specific: decide on how much you'd like to lose, or how much you'd like to bench press instead of increase strength
- b. Measureable: you must have a metric to be able to easily know whether you have achieved the goal or not at the end of the year
- c. Achievable: Can you do it with your time ,knowledge and resources
- d. Relevant: does the goal align with overall personal goals, values and beliefs
- e. Time based: set a realistic time frame

2. Start with WHY

What is the deeper compelling reason as to why you want to achieve THAT particular goal, out of anything you could have chosen? Remind yourself of why you started to help yourself through challenges.

As Friedrich Nietzsche said, "He who has a WHY to live can bear almost any HOW".

3. Get the right people on the bus

Build your own support network of like minded people who you know will support you and your goals, keep you accountable and challenge you when needed.

4. Start with Small Successes

Great Pyramid of Giza wasn't built overnight. Break down your goals into smaller stepping stones and build your self-esteem, self-discipline and momentum by laying one brick at a time, which in turn will lead to huge successes later in the year.

5. Build Self-Awareness

Take time to reflect on how your goals are going, this will allow you to catch yourself when you are starting to lay blame, deny and give excuse for why you aren't getting the results you want. Another big one is to be able to be aware of when you're falling into relapse that is slipping into bad habits again. PHYSICAL FITNESS DURING GLOBAL CRISIS

While this community has been severely impacted by the current crisis, it can also be a key contributor in solutions to contain and overcome it, as well as in promoting rights and values in times of social distancing; as the world begins to recover there will be significant issues to be addressed to ensure the safety of sporting events at all levels and the well-being of the sports organizations.

Global recommendations are all adults must accumulate at least - 150 Minutes of moderate – intensity or 75 minutes of vigorous-intensity physical activity per week, the benefits of such periodic exercise are proven very helpful, especially in times of anxiety, crisis and fear. There are concerns therefore that in the context of the pandemic, lack of access to regular sporting or exercise routines may result in challenges to the immune system, physical health, including exacerbating of existing diseases that have their roots in a sedentary lifestyle.

Any activity is better than none, and more activity provides more physical and mental health benefits.

Staying physically active during self-isolation

How much?

World Health Organisation recommendations for physical activity are:



150 minutes of moderate-intensity, or 75 minutes of vigourous exercise, per week.





Muscle-strengthening exercises **two or more days per week**.

And how I do that?





Take breaks from continuously sitting in front of your computer, tablet or smartphone **every 20-30 minutes**. Take a 1-2 minute walk around the house or play with a pet!

Try to alternate between sitting and standing, where possible, by creating a standing desk area.



Make stairs your new best friend



Stair climbing is an extremely time-efficient way to maintain fitness and as little as three 20-second fast stair-climbs a day can improve fitness in only 6 weeks.

Maintain strength using your own bodyweight



Research shows that bodyweight home-based strength exercises such as **press-ups**, **sit-ups**, and **planks** are as important for health as aerobic exercise.

Aim for at least a couple of bodyweight sessions per week:

- 2-4 sets of 8-15 repetitions of each exercise
- 2-3 minutes rest between sets.
- O Dance the COVID-19 blues away!

Dancing is an excellent way to protect the heart and maintain fitness – it can easily reach **moderate** and even **vigorous intensity exercise**, while **releasing endorphins** to help you get through the lonely days.



6 Give pets and kids more playtime than they've ever had!



It's a good opportunity to bond more with the little 2 and 4 legged members of your family through active play.

Both kids and dogs will welcome more one-on-one time with you and you'll increase the amount of exercise you get by allocating time to keep them busy.




